Jasmine Paolini (ITA #14) vs. [Q] Sara Errani (ITA #102)

Paolini leads 1-0

Paolini and **Errani** are facing off for the first time in a main draw match; the pair's only previous matchup came during a qualifying match at Bogota 2019...**Paolini** is currently at her career-high ranking (No.14) after winning Dubai, the biggest title of her career...**Paolini** is playing her first-ever match at Stuttgart... **Paolini** and **Errani** are also competing together in doubles at Stuttgart...**Errani** has not defeated a Top 20 player since 2016 (d. Suarez Navarro at Sydney)... **Errani**'s win in qualifying over World No.26 Anna Kalinskaya was her best win by ranking since defeating No.21 Barbora Strycova at the 2016 Olympics

[5] Zheng Qinwen (CHN #7) vs. Sorana Cirstea (ROU #29)

First Meeting

Zheng making second appearance at Stuttgart, where her previous result was reaching 2r in 2023 (I. eventual champion Swiatek)... **Cirstea** making second main-draw appearance in Stuttgart where she last played in 2014 (I. Goerges)... **Cirstea** owns 21 wins in career over Top 10 players, most recently over No.8 Marketa Vondrousova at Dubai 2024... Both players own one title on clay: **Zheng** won the title on Palermo in 2023 and **Cirstea** won title at Istanbul 2021... **Zheng** reached career high ranking earlier this year of No. 7 on Jan.29, 2024

[6] Marketa Vondrousova (CZE #8) vs. Donna Vekic (CRO #37)

Series tied 1-1

Vondrousova making fourth main-draw appearance at Stuttgart, where her best result was R16 in 2021 (I. Halep) and 2018 (I. Svitolina)....**Vekic** making third appearance at Stuttgart, where her best result was QF run in 2019 (I. Osaka)... Best result on clay for **Vondrousova** was R-Up at 2019 Roland Garros (I. Barty) and 2019 Istanbul (I. Martic)... **Vekic** owns 12-25 career record against players from the Czech Republic... **Vondrousova** won their most previous encounter at 2023 Wimbledon and **Vekic** won their first meeting at 2018 Hobart; this will be their first meeting on clay...

[WC] Tatjana Maria (GER #66) vs. Elise Mertens (BEL #30)

Maria is looking for her best win by ranking since defeating No.28 Anhelina Kalinina at 2023 Cleveland...Maria has never advanced past the second round at Stuttgart...Maria is coming off a quarterfinal run at Bogota, where she lost to eventual champion Camila Osorio...Mertens is coming off a quarterfinal appearance at Charleston, where she fell to eventual champion Danielle Collins... Mertens is competing for only the second time at Stuttgart... Mertens is looking for her first-ever win at Stuttgart

- Finished 2023 by breaking into Top 30 for first time, achieving No. 29 on Oct 23, 2023 after becoming runner-up at Monastir (l. Mertens). Also achieved runner-up at Palermo and SF at Zhengzhou (l. Zheng both times) as well as QFs at Lyon (l. Garcia) and Cincinnati as a qualifier (l. eventual champion Gauff). Enjoyed two Top 10 wins (No.10 Garcia and No.4 Rybakina).
- In 2022, finished R-Up at Cluj-Napoca (l. Blinkova), while made back-to-back SF at Palermo (l. Bronzetti) and Warsaw (l. eventual champion Garcia)
- Also reached QF at Lyon (l. Yastremska), Portoroz (l. eventual champion Siniakova) and Parma (l. Kovinic)
- Broke into Top 50 on January 31, 2021
- Posted near-Top 50 season finish in 2021 after capturing first WTA singles title of career at Portoroz (d. Riske in F)
- Strong season finish also brought SF run at Courmayeur(l. eventual champion Vekic) and QF effort at Linz (l. Halep); posted best win of season over No.18 Mertens en route to 3r at Indian Wells (l. Pegula)
- Also in 2021 won the WTA 125K event in Bol, Croatia (d. Rus in F) and was R-Up at the same level in Saint Malo (l. Golubic) Captured first WTA doubles title in 2021, at Hamburg(w/Teichmann)
- In 2021, for first time in career, contested the full suite of all four Grand Slam events; reached 2r at Roland Garros and USOpen, equalling best previous Slam result
- · In 2020, reached 2r four times at WTA tournaments, including Roland Garros (l. Kvitova)
- Highlights of 2019 included QF showings at Guangzhou and Palermo, a SF run at the WTA 125K Series event at Karlsruhe, lifting seventh, eighth and ninth ITF Circuit titles of her career, at \$60KBrescia-ITA, \$25K ITF/Curtiba-BRA and \$100K ITF/Tokyo-JPN, and qualifying for maiden Grand Slam main draw at Roland Garros (l. Kasatkina in 1r)
- Ended 2018 ranked No.180, with season highlight a maiden WTA singles QF at Prague (d. No.15 Kasatkina, l. Zhang)
- Made WTA main draw debut at 2017 Bastad (l. Suarez Navarro in 1r) and also fell 1r at Guangzhou and in qualifying a further three
- Part of Italy's Billie Jean King Cup team 2017-19
- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2015 Rome

• Prodgced best results of 2023 at WTA 125 series 2**d**15 events with R-Up showing at San Luis Potosi (l. Cocclaretto) and Ocharest (l.16harma); a & 5 reached SF at Florence (l. Townsend).

- 2010 Opened 2021 clay court season by advancing to QF at Bogota (l. Zjdansek). Reached further QFs on the surface last year at Parma (l. Stephens) 2009 2008 and Hamburg (l. Yastremska) 1r
 - Played only three tour level main draw event in 2020; reached QF at Palermo while fell 2r2ft both Acapulco and Roland Garros
 - Finished 2019 season ranked No.110; campaign was highlighted by SF run at Hiroshima (l. Hibino)
 - Best result of 2019 was OF at Bogotá (l. Sharma); fell 1r four times and in qualifying on five occasions, and won one singles title on ITF Circuit
 - Ended 2018 just outside Top 100 (at No.108) after a campaign in which she reached QF at Rabat (l. Mertens); reached 3r at Charleston and captured won one WTA 125K Series singles title and 27th career doubles title -- at Auckland (w/Schoofs)
 - Ended 2017 season ranked No.143 (previous year-end finish outside the Top 100 came in 2006 at No.171). Missed around two months of 2017 season (August to October) due to an antidoping violation; departed tour following 2017 Washington DC, returning with SF run at Tianjin in October (l. Sabalenka)
 - Following return to competition at end of 2017, won ITF \$60k-Suzhou-CHN and reached SF at ITF \$100k-Dubai-UAE (l. Bencic)
 - Posted ninth successive Top 50 season in 2016, highlighted by winning ninth (and biggest) WTA singles title of career at Premier-level Dubai (d. Strycova in F) - owns 9-10 record overall in finals, and reached at least one final every year between 2011-2016
 - Was previously 0-4 in Premier-level singles finals, finishing runner-up at 2014 Rome, 2014 Paris [Indoors], 2013 Dubai and 2013 Paris [Indoors]
 - Represented Italy in doubles w/Vinci at 2016 Rio Olympics (l. Safarova/Strycova in QF); the team of Errani/Vinci reunited in Montréal for the first time since playing Fed Cup in February 2015

- Owns nine singles and one doubles title on ITF Circuit
- Made professional debut on ITF Circuit in Italy in 2011
- Won her eighth WTA singles title and first in two years - at 2015 Rio de Janeiro (d. Schmiedlova in F) and finished runner-up at 2015 Bucharest (l. Schmiedlova in F)
- Qualified for inaugural 2015 WTA Elite Trophy in Zhuhai, but unable to progress past group stage
- Owns three Top 5 wins in her career: No.4
 A.Radwanska at 2013 Roland Garros, No.2 Li at 2014 Rome, No.4 Kvitova at 2015 Beijing
- Dropped out of Top 10 after 2014 Miami for the first time since June 11, 2012 - rose as high as No.5 the week of May 20, 2013
- Qualified for WTA Finals in singles in 2012 and 2013, going 2-4 in round robin matches
- Owns 27 career doubles titles, including five majors (all w/VInci) at 2012 Roland Garros, 2012 US Open, 2013-14 Australian Open and 2014 Wimbledon
- In total, spent 87 weeks as doubles World No.1
- Breakthrough year on Tour came in 2012, reaching Roland Garros final (l. Sharapova), lifting four titles and compiling 55-22 record
- Made Top 10 debut following run in Paris, rising from No.24 to No.10 on June 11, 2012
- Member of victorious Italian Fed Cup teams in 2009-10 and 2013
- In 2008 lifted first two WTA singles titles, first at Palermo (d. Koryttseva in F) and then Portoroz (d. Medina Garrigues in F)
- Made Top 100 debut on July 23, 2007 and Top 50 debut on July 28, 2008
- Came through qualifying to reach maiden WTA SF at 2007 Acapulco (l. Pennetta)
- Reached 2r on WTA main draw debut at 2006 Bogota (as qualifier, d. Uberoi, l. Dulko)
- Made professional debut on ITF Circuit in 2002


